



Continuous Line Drawing

Create a continuous line collage drawing inspired by Rembrandt.

Step 1

Look at Rembrandt's, *Self-Portrait in a Cap, Wide-Eyed and Open-Mouthed*, 1630.

Identify the main outline shapes and details.

Use the black pen to draw outlines around the areas of interest to you.

Do not let your pen leave the paper.

This is called a continuous line drawing, so your pen stays on the paper and you have to problem solve how to reach the different areas of the drawing.



You will need...

- Glue sticks
- Felt tip pens
- A4 Coloured sugar paper



Step 2

Use pens to colour in the shapes you have created. Rip the sugar paper into small pieces and glue them into the shapes.

Combine the two approaches to fill all of the white paper with colour and texture.

Step 3

Use the black pen to redefine the outlines. You could also embellish and decorate some of the coloured shapes with more mark making and patterns.

Develop further

Create a stencil drawing- take the main outlines from the drawing and draw with masking tape. Cover all the paper with colour then remove the tape, to reveal the completed drawing.
